



# ARTS EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES FOR DOE STUDENTS & TEACHERS HSFCA & DOE PROGRAMS

Hawai'i State Foundation on Culture and the Arts (HSFCA) is a state government arts agency whose mission is to promote, perpetuate, preserve and encourage culture and the arts, history and the humanities as central to the quality of life of the people of Hawai'i.

## The Art Bento Program @ HiSAM

The Art Bento Program at HiSAM (Hawai'i State Art Museum) is a four-part standards-based museum education program for public and charter schools on O'ahu. Applications are accepted annually for grades 2 to 6. HiSAM galleries are used as a catalyst for inquiry-based learning in literacy, visual and performing arts. Teaching Artists from the HSFCA's Artistic Teaching Partners Roster lead by modeling techniques and strategies to actively engage students and elicit responses to artworks currently on view in the museum. A professional development session for teachers, pre- and post-museum visits in the classroom, and funding for buses for the museum visit are provided.

## Artists in the Schools Program (AITS)

Public and charter schools statewide (K-12) can apply annually for up to \$6,000 for an arts residency provided at their school by a teaching artist on the HSFCA's Artistic Teaching Partners Roster. Students engage in hands-on, creative learning in dance, drama, visual arts, music or literary arts for at least eight sessions (five if secondary). Many of the teaching artists integrate their art form with other core curriculum areas, thus meeting both Fine Arts and other core standards. Schools must contribute 10% of the grant request.

## Art in Public Places—Artists in Residence Program

The Art in Public Places — Artists in Residence (APP-AIR) Program is a collaborative program of the DOE and HSFCA. The program was established to implement an integrated visual arts in education program, while providing commissioned works of art in public schools. Program funds allow for the participation of approximately three school projects per year. Each project is budgeted with a maximum of \$100,000 to hire the services of a professional visual artist. The APP-AIR project includes an educational component that is integrated into the school's curriculum. As part of the educational component, the artist is required to provide a residency in the school equivalent to 14-16 days of instruction during the term of the project. ## Poetry Out Loud

Poetry Out Loud is a national poetry recitation competition for high school students presented by the National Endowment for the Arts and the Poetry Foundation. The competition has a pyramid structure, with school winners competing in state finals for the opportunity to represent Hawai'i in the national finals in Washington, DC for a \$20,000 grand prize. By encouraging students to memorize and perform great poems, POL helps them master public speaking skills, build self-confidence, and learn about their literary heritage. Open to public, private, charter and homeschool high school students statewide.


