TITLE:	Hawai'i State Foundation on Culture and the Arts Art Bento Program @ HiSAM
PURPOSE:	<p>To provide a standards and inquiry-based museum education program for Grades 2 to 6 students and their teachers. Art Bento's theme, "Responding to Art," connects to current art standards and ELA Common Core Standards. Activities enliven participants' understanding of art as a tool for developing critical thinking skills and visual literacy. Teachers learn inquiry-based strategies to facilitate engaged learning through observation and conversation.</p> <p>The program utilizes works of art from the HSFCA's Art in Public Places Collection at HiSAM.</p>
ELIGIBILITY:	<p>All Oahu elementary public and charter schools are eligible. At the time of application, a school must have been in operation, providing services to its students, for a minimum of one semester. First time applications may take precedence over those from schools that have participated two years in a row. Schools will be notified of the selection results by late May.</p>
REQUIREMENTS FOR SCHOOL SELECTION	<p>For the 2021-2022 school year, schools will be selected based on the following requirements:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A minimum of six classes is required to participate in the Art Bento Program @ HiSAM. Classes must be grouped by grade level, i.e. (3) Grade 4 classes, (3) Grade 5 classes. 2. Only one application per school with a maximum of 12 classes to be served. 3. Commitment from administration and participating faculty to: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Designate a staff person to be point of contact for the school and coordinate the residency schedule and deliverables. The required Instructional time per class is 45-60 minutes for pre and post visits and ½ day (8:45 – 11:30 a.m. <u>minimum</u>) for the museum field trip; b. Designate a classroom space where the teaching artist can establish a "residency" to do the art activities. Please note – visual arts sessions require tables and a sink, poetry requires tables, while dance, drama, and music require an open cleared space to comfortably fit all participants;

	<p>c. Schedule a 1.5 hour mandatory time block for all participating teachers. This is a 30 minute orientation session and an hour-long professional development led by a Teaching Artist, as part of the Art Bento Program @ HiSAM residency, prior to sessions with students;</p> <p>d. Participate fully in all residency activities as well as facilitate three discussions with students based on art reproductions provided by the Art Bento Program. Participating teachers will complete and submit a Response to Art Worksheet for each discussion;</p> <p>e. Notify the State Representative and Senator from the school's district, in writing, of the receipt of an Art Bento residency. The notification should thank the legislators for funding the Art Bento Program through support for the HSFCAs Art in Public Places Program, and invite the legislators to observe some part of the Art Bento residency. A copy of the notification shall be provided to the Art Bento Program Coordinator;</p> <p>f. Participating teachers individually complete a final online program evaluation – due 2 weeks after residency ends.</p>

2. Importance of the arts	Explanation is vague.	Provides a list of general benefits.	Provides a list of specific benefits to their students and teachers. Provides details of how the arts are implemented at their school AND/OR their need for arts services.
3. Program benefit to students and teachers	Vague about benefit(s) to students or teachers or both.	Identifies benefit(s) to only students or only teachers, benefits are theoretically stated.	Identifies benefit(s) to both students and teachers, and expresses how the teachers will use the information gained. For repeat schools, applicant explains what the teachers and students gained from the prior participation; how they will continue to benefit and build on the experience through further participation; and cites specific examples.

Art Bento Museum Education Program @ (HiSAM)



Hawai'i State Foundation on Culture and the Arts (HSFCA) is pleased to offer the Art Bento Program @ HiSAM, a standards-based museum education program. Students grades 2 – 6 explore the theme “Responding to Art,” along with their teachers. Artworks from the HSFCA’s Art in Public Places Collection, on view at the Hawai'i State Art Museum (HiSAM), serve as a catalyst to communication and connection. Activities foster 21st Century learning skills: careful observation, critical thinking, incisive listening, and thoughtful speech.

A UNIQUE 4-PART MUSEUM LEARNING EXPERIENCE



1 A Professional development session for teachers (1 hour). A trained Teaching Artist (TA) models the responding process of **ODIE: Observe, Describe, Interpret and cite Evidence** for thinking. Classroom teachers then practice facilitating conversations using this engagement strategy, which corresponds to Depth of Knowledge (DOK) Levels 3 & 4 thinking.

2 A classroom visit follows, with students introduced to ODIE by “their” TA, followed by the start of a standards-based fine art lesson.

3 The Museum visit: Students experience an inquiry-based guided tour in HiSAM’s galleries, practice ODIE, and continue art-making with their TA. An “I Love Art Gallery” visit provides hands-on learning and a snack provides sustenance!

4 Art Bento concludes with a final classroom visit by the TA. Participants reflect on connections made through the museum visit (seeing the *real art*) and the art-making experience; concepts and vocabulary are reviewed.

THE ART BENTO CONCEPT is compact, cohesive and modular (like the convenient lunch-time favorite). Each segment complements the last and scaffolds to the next. Inquiry-based activities connect to current Fine Arts and ELA Common Core Standards.

ART BENTO OBJECTIVES

- Increase opportunities for arts education
- Develop literacy through the arts using arts-based inquiry strategies;
- Actively engage students and teachers through observation, discussion and critical thinking.
